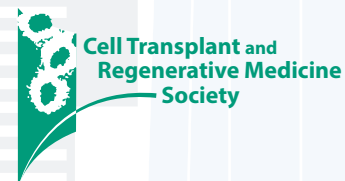

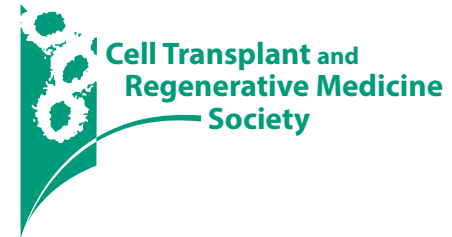
Organizers

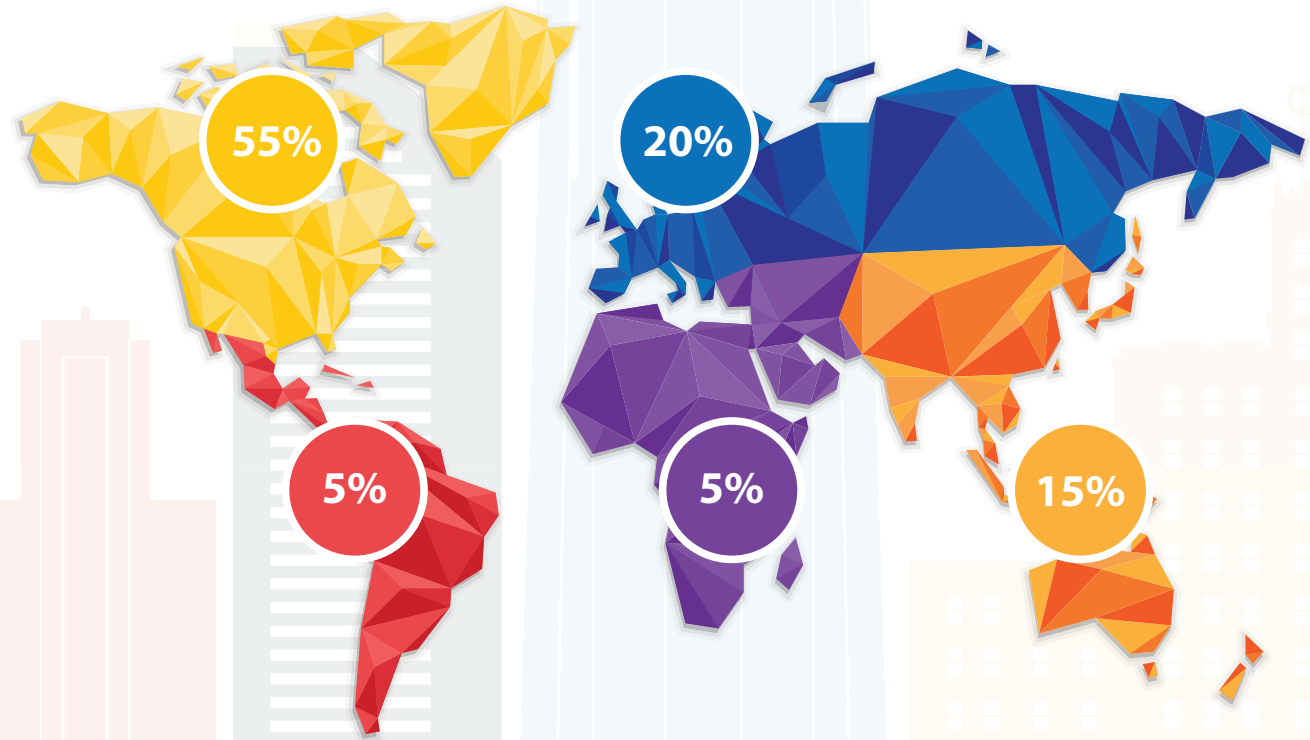

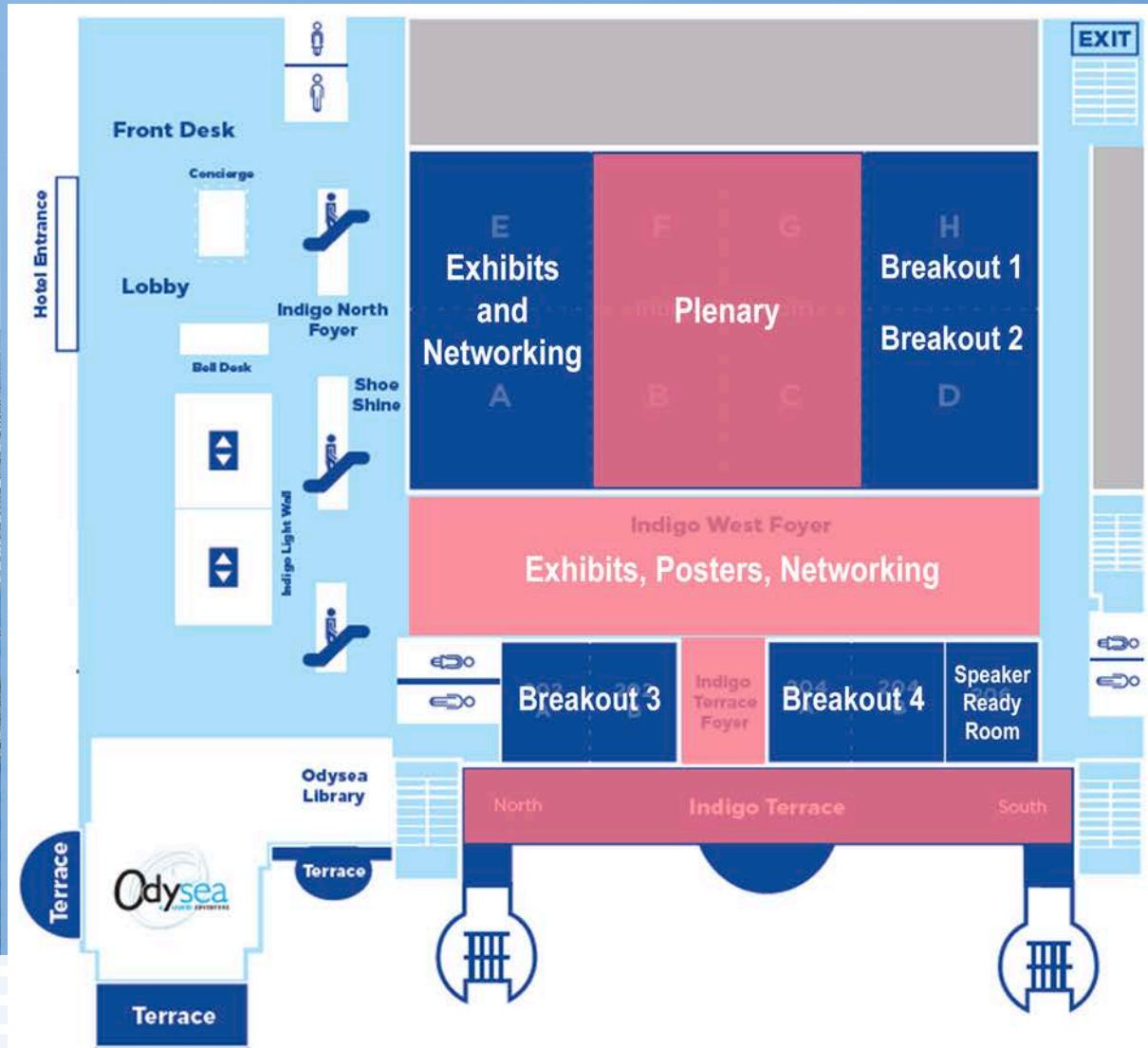
